4-H SPECIAL POULTRY PROJECT

4-H members will be chosen to receive Rhode Island Red chicks after the applications have been reviewed and your facilities have been checked out by an Extension Agent. They will arrive in mid to late April.

Finalists are required to pay a \$25.00 deposit when your 25 chicks are ordered. You must bring 6 of those pullets to the show and sale at the County Fair in September. The \$25.00 deposit will be refunded at the show. The pullets will be auctioned off to the highest bidder, with the proceeds going toward the purchase of chicks for next year. 4-H'ers will get to keep the ribbons and prize money awarded at the County Show.

A successful poultry project requires:

- 1. An out door thermometer.
- 2. A brooder of some type (an electric heat lamp). Note: Baby chicks need a room temperature of 95 degrees F for the first week, then reduce the temperature by 5 degrees each week for the next 4 weeks.
- 3. Plenty of clean water and fresh feed.
- 4. Dry and <u>safe</u> housing. Note: Yes, your dogs, cats and some little brothers will kill your baby chicks.
- 5. You will be the only parents these chicks have that's a big responsibility!
