

## 4-H SPECIAL POULTRY PROJECT

4-H members interested in this year's 4-H Special Poultry Project should submit the application on the back of this page by March 2<sup>nd</sup>. 4-H poultry project finalists will be chosen to receive Black Star chicks after the applications have been reviewed and your facilities have been checked or discussed with by an Extension Agent. Baby chicks are scheduled to arrive in April.

Finalists are required to pay a \$25.00 deposit before your 25 chicks arrive. You must bring 6 of those pullets to the show and sale on a Saturday morning at the Robertson County Fair in late August. The \$25.00 deposit will be refunded at the show. The pullets will be auctioned off to the highest bidder, with the proceeds going toward the purchase of chicks for next year. 4-H'ers will get to keep the ribbons and prize money awarded at the County Show.

## A successful poultry project requires:

- 1. An outdoor thermometer.
- 2. A brooder of some type (an electric heat lamp).

  Note: Baby chicks need a room temperature of 95 degrees F for the first week. Then reduce the temperature by 5 degrees each week for the next 4 weeks.
- 3. Plenty of clean water and fresh feed.
- 4. Dry and <u>safe</u> housing.

  Note: Yes, your dogs, cats and some little brothers will kill your baby chicks.
- 5. You will be the only parents these chicks have that's a big responsibility!
