Learn By Doing: Speaking Contest

4-H members should be ready for their first hands on communication skill activity – Public Speaking.

Follow the rules and guidelines on the public speaking hand out that was provided at your first 4-H Club meeting.

Teachers, if you have great participation, you may want to have a practice round of speeches ahead of time. Choose the best 10-15 speeches or readings to present in the club meeting. Use this activity to meet TN Education standard.



Everyone who says their speaking assignment, in class or in the club meeting, will be recognized. Participants will receive a 4-H pencil and a sticker on the sticker chart.

4th Grade: Find a poem or short story to read for a minute. Work on presentation and delivery skills. The top three speakers will be invited to the county contest–where they will deliver a speech they have written. The time limit for the county contest is 1-3 minutes.

5th Grade—8th grade: Write a speech on any topic-most successful speeches are usually a persuasive speech. Not a book or Wikipedia report. Club contest time is limited to 1-3 minutes (5th grade) and 2-7 minutes (middle school). County Contest: 2-7 minutes for all grades.

9th-12th Grade: Write a speech—topic should include 4-H. County contest time limit is 3-7 minutes.
