Service Project: Feed America First, 2025 TAFCE Conference Service Project: Food and monetary donations, either personal check or cash, will be accepted. Shelf-stable, protein-heavy foods are best (let's try to donate healthier versions) such as: peanut butter, canned tuna/chicken, canned vegetables and fruits, canned soups and chili, microwave rice packs, meal kits such as Hamburger Helper, pasta salads, and mac and cheese. Snacks such as pretzels, peanuts, Pop-Tarts, cereal, etc. are great for kids as well! Cases would be appreciated, and often easier/cheaper per item to purchase, but not required. Over 70% of what they distribute is fresh, perishable foods such as dairy, fruit, and veggies, so having additional shelf-stable food donations is a blessing!

With some of their food manufacturing/logistics connections, Feed America First can often stretch a dollar further than it would go buying direct from a grocery store, such as using monetary donations to purchase food in bulk for a fraction of its retail value. They can provide enough food for 10-15 meals for every \$1 donated. Therefore, cash and checks are welcome. Please make checks out to Feed America First.

Class Descriptions

2 and 2B. Alcohol ink planter: Jeanie Such

Learn how to make a stunning alcohol ink creation on a 6” ceramic pot. This will be a fun and fast class! You will also receive an instruction sheet on how to seal your pot before using it. Sealer is not included. No kits available.



3. Mosaic Toni Randall

This will be a 2-hour workshop limited to 15 participants. It will cover a brief overview of the history of mosaic art and the opportunity to make a small glass mosaic trivet. Supplies provided are a 5” glass trivet, design, glue, glass for the mosaic, and grout.



4. Say it With a Card: Mary Beth Henley and Barbara Brackett

Create 3 beautiful cards with a variety of sentiments. Cards and techniques will vary each class. All supplies will be provided. No kits.



5. Busted Canvas: Joy McLerran

Busted canvas is made with a board canvas and a regular canvas. On the regular canvas, a napkin or tissue paper is mod podged to the inside and outside. On the board canvas, a designer napkin is mod podged and then the canvases are hot glued together. The regular canvas is cut to uncover the design on the board canvas and decorated with different flowers and ribbons.



6. and 6B. Bezel Necklace: Vee Wills

This beautiful pendant is made with a bezel and scrapbook paper.



7. Basket Woven around Qui jar.: Kay Kass

This class repurposes a Qui yogurt jar into a cute little basket. Assorted colors to choose from. This basket has a wood base and is good for beginners and experienced weavers.



8. Beaded Basket: Kay Kass

Class will offer the opportunity to weave a beginner basket, there will be several colors to choose from. This is great beginner basket but also for all levels. 6" diameter x 4" tall



9. Acrylic Painting: Penny West

Come practice acrylic shading techniques while painting a cute snowman on an 8x10 pre-stretched canvas.



10. Embellished Accessory: Tammy Patterson

Bring a T-shirt, apron, or accessory to embellish with vinyl or rhinestones. Leave with an entry for fashion revue! Make sure your item can be ironed.



11. and 11B. Calendar Card: Rhonda Corkin

Sign up to make Next Years Calendar that turns into an easel fold Post-it note holder. Great for your desk or as a gift for friends, family, teachers, co-workers or just because. Everything will be included. Just sign up and show up. I will walk you through all the steps to create a perfect gift.



12. Foundation Paper Piecing: Carolyn Binkley

First Hour: Traditional paper piecing. You sew on lines in number order. We will be making the tree. You can be put in a quilted project or make an ornament.

Second Hour: We will use the freezer paper technique. This one we don't sew on the paper. You can put in a quilted project or make an ornament. Patterns and instruction will be provided.

Supply list: Tree – 2 to 3 green prints, ground print, sky print and the trunk fabric. I will have some of the wood looking fabric with me to use.

Supply list: Santa - Red fabric (suit & arm; hat), white fabric (beard & arm; hat trim), skin color looking fabric for face.

21.Sewing Hacks and Hints: Deborah Foster and Linda Prince

In this presentation, we will show helpful ways of using common household items to simplify your sewing, quilting, and craft projects. We will also share products and tools that we find useful in our sewing/craft rooms.

Deborah Foster is a retired middle school math teacher; She presently serves as secretary of her local FCE and the Marshall County Council Education Chair.

Linda Prince is a retired Family and Consumer Science Teacher and FCCLA Adviser. She presently serves as President of her local FCE Club and President Advisor of the Marshall County Council. Both ladies enjoy sewing and crafting. They also set up at several craft fairs throughout the year.

Suicide affects all ethnicities, economic classes, social groups and age ranges. The Cowboy Up program offers hope and support. Regina's book **HUGHISMS** is a collection of life lessons shared through the wit and wisdom of her father with proceeds helping the Cowboy Up program. Regina has been in education, and she is the founder, presenter, and facilitator of the "Cowboy Up" Suicide Prevention program.

Learn the eight most diagnosed types of Dementia and how to recognize the risks and signs. Instruction will also educate listeners in proactive behaviors. Dale McDaniel is a retired educator and a national pickle ball competitor. When she isn't volunteering, she and her husband are building their home together in Rock Island.

26.FCL Parliamentary Procedure: Sarah Sharp and Sandra Poston

"Ready or Not Ready". Understanding and Using Robert's Rules of Order for Better Meetings. This is an FCL Class, 1.5 hours credit can be earned, certificates will be awarded. No charge.

Sarah Sharp has been an FCE member for over 10 years after retiring from the Tennessee Department of Education. Currently she is TAFCE Secretary, Central Region Fashion Revue Chairman, and Wilson County FCE Secretary.
